Villages are there to help with small projects which might no longer be safe, such as climbing a ladder to change a light bulb. Villages provide social gatherings such as happy hour meetups and educational outlets to ward off loneliness.

The services provided by each Village differs as each one is an independent organization, but all Villages are formed specifically to meet the needs of those in their community.

Exciting things are happening in the Village movement and Village to Village Network stands ready to help newly forming and operational Villages get over any hurdles. Village to Village Network was formed by Villages specifically for this purpose. We are the sole organization working to expand the Village movement across the United States and even to other countries! We're moving forward, so get behind us and become part of this whirlwind!

Methow At Home, the ruggedly remote rural Village



Methow At Home now begins its 4th year serving the Methow Valley (total population approx. 5,000) in north central Washington. Ours is a rural and ruggedly remote Village nestled between the North Cascade mountains to the west and the

Okanogan range to the east.

For us, anything beyond routine medical care and small town shopping, requires a minimum round trip drive of 4 hours and 200 miles. However, for us, a walk to a beautiful alpine lake is almost in our backyard.

Living in such remarkable terrain is double-edged as pristine natural beauty goes hand in hand with challenging living conditions including, extremes of weather, rugged topography and geographic and social isolation. Challenges such as these



necessitated residents long ago developing a strong caring community.

Although this spirit of community preceded the introduction of Methow At Home by many years, in 2015 several Valley visionaries felt the Village concept could further strengthen the web of support which this Valley holds each other within. Now, 3 years later, with 175+ members and 150+ volunteers, Methow At Home is helping members, some of whom were born in this Valley as far back as the 1930s, to stay in homes a short walking distance from where they were born. This success reflects the culture of a community which recognizes personal independence is strengthened by interdependence within one's community.

One of our members who recently underwent extensive surgery, yet recuperated in her mountain home in mid-winter, expressed the following - "Grateful really doesn't cover it. I have been attached to this community for decades and this has been my spirit home for over forty years. I belong here. I will be FOREVER making an effort to return the care that I have received."

For us, it is abundantly clear that the Village concept can work in every corner people inhabit.

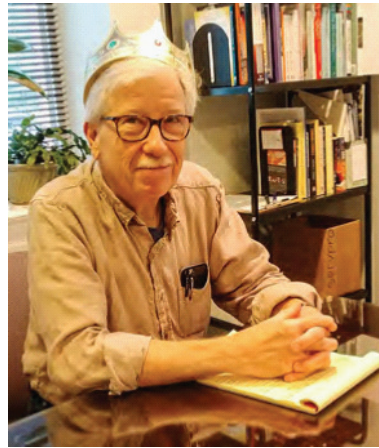
We're working on securing some amazing speakers who will address the importance of these connections — stay tuned!

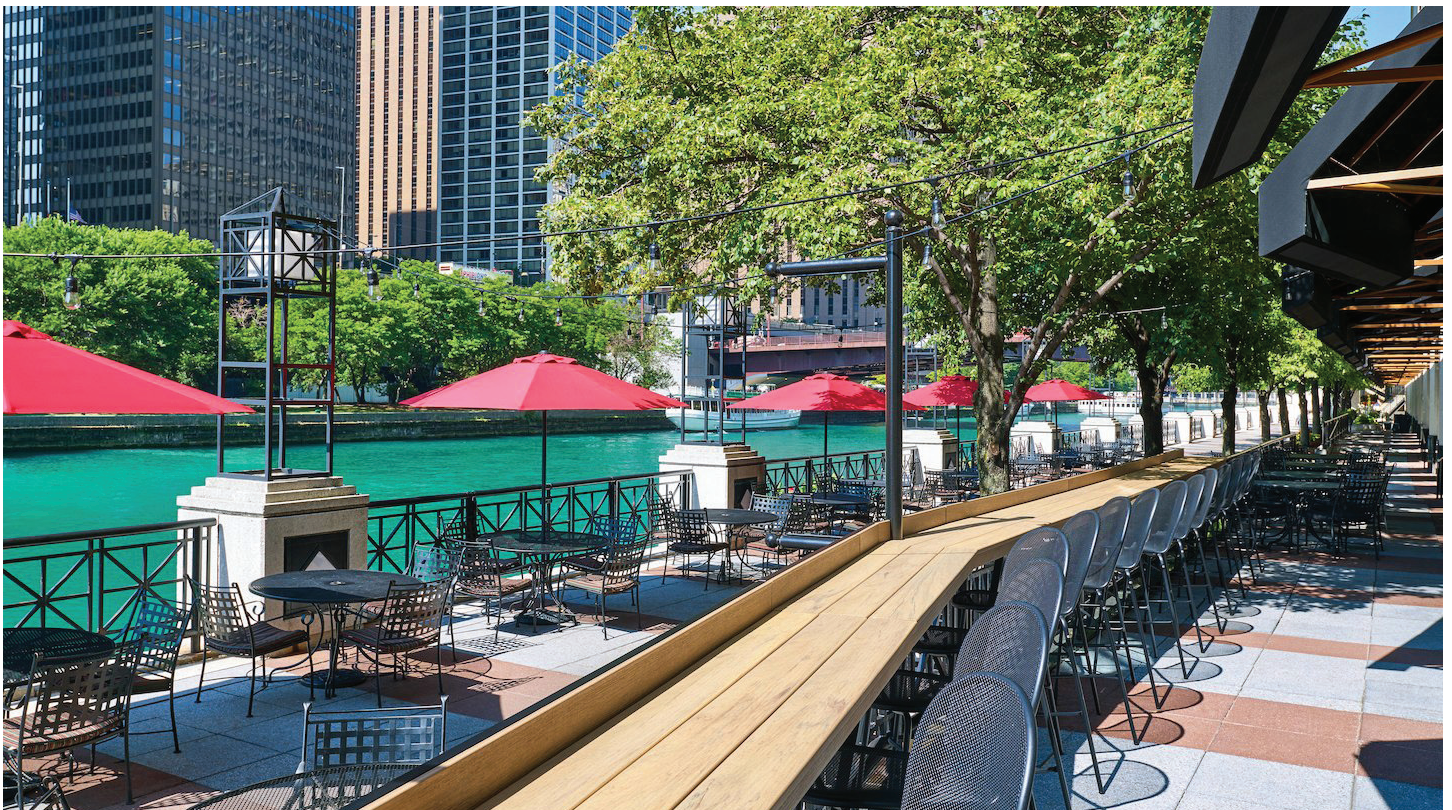
