There are many Villages out there that are applying for grants from state, local and private foundations. Showing solidarity in numbers allows us to advocate and unite our model for aging, which will only strengthen each individual Village. We hope that many of our smaller Villages will take advantage of this great opportunity.

Check out our membership level details and changes on the next page of this newsletter. We hope that these changes will alleviate the financial burden for some of our smaller member Villages and encourage others to join the Network if the cost of membership was the limiting factor.

VtV Network is the sole organization formed by Villages to support the creation and continued success of Villages. We are stronger when we stand together to share our experience and knowledge with each other.

Changes to VtV Network membership dues

Here are the new membership dues! We hope these changes will encourage more Villages to join the national Village Movement!

Hub and Spoke

We have always had a Hub and Spoke dues level, but prior to this year, only the hub was shown on the Network map. Now hubs can join and they will be on the map, while spokes will sign up separately and their website, information and affiliation with the hub will be shown also! Member spokes will have their own marker on the Network map! Hubs are reduced to **\$425** per year but each spoke that registers will have **\$100** annual dues. Hubs will get 20 secondary members, and spokes will get 10 secondary memberships! All memberships will have access to member benefits such as preferred providers and discounts, webinars and the documents library.



Opportunity Membership

In the past, our Opportunity Members joined at \$125 for six months. We all know, that it takes more than six months to form a Village. We also know, for our movement to grow, we need new communities to take advantage of the tools, resources and mentoring opportunities we have available. To help these developing Villages

get going, the new dues fees will be **\$150 for a whole year!** This is renewable for an additional year and will allow for 10 secondary members. This effectively reduces the two-year cost for a developing Village by \$200! As always, Opportunity members have full access to VtVN's member benefits.

NEW!

Individual Village Membership

This new category is for Villages that have annual budgets that are under \$25,000. The membership comes with one primary, Village representation on the Network map, links to their website and information listed for referrals. The member will have access to all VtV Network materials and benefits. The fee for the Individual Village Membership is **\$150** per year. This membership does not include any additional secondary or tertiary members.

Village Friend

This membership is for people who wish to support and remain involved in Village to Village Network and the Village movement. To qualify, an individual must have previously been a primary or secondary member of VtV Network. Typically, these individuals were former staff or board members of a Village. This membership is **\$150** per year and gets full access to all Network resources but does not include secondary or tertiary members.

Other membership categories will remain unchanged at this time.

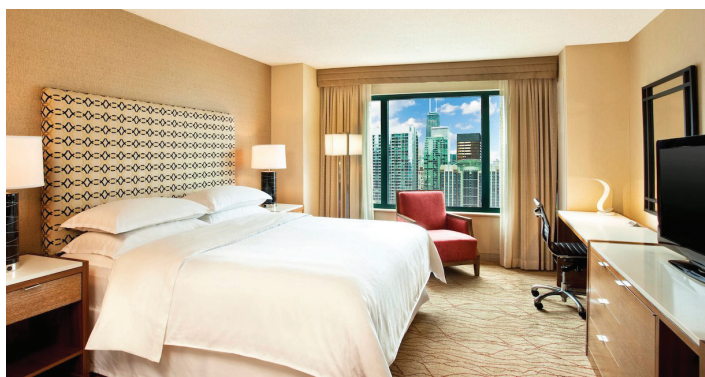
BOOK YOUR HOTEL ROOM

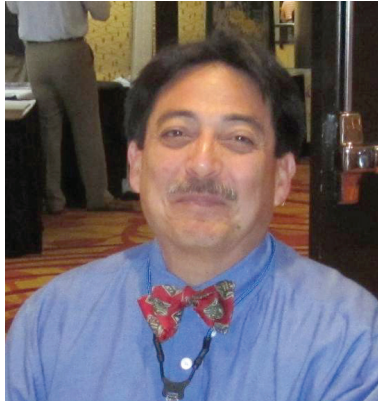

New board member elected

The Village to Village Network Board of Directors just elected their newest member!

Edgar (Eddie)

Rivas of Potomac, Maryland, will join the ranks with more than 34 years of experience working on issues that impact older adults.



The New York Times once listed Rivas as one of the six most powerful aging-policy lobbyists in Washington. As part of a long career, he served on the staff of the U.S. House Select Committee on Aging and also held positions at state and area offices on aging and national aging organizations including AARP.

"I wanted to join the Board because I wanted to enhance my volunteerism and the growth of Villages throughout the nation," Rivas said.

"As a baby boomer, I understand that the public sector will never be able to support our long term care needs as we age. Hence, Villages are one approach to addressing this growing need, that we now know will be even greater when Millennials reach old age."

Rivas is a planner and policy analyst with project management skills and hands-on experience in advocacy and coalition building, with an emphasis on working on behalf of underserved communities, as well as extensive experience in the aging and disabilities field.

"I believe that Villages should join Village to Village Network for knowledge and wisdom garnered from other more-experienced Villages; to provide support and camaraderie to each other; to strive to meet the needs and demands of an aging population; to advocate for public policy that helps address those needs; and to help assure the sustainability of the Network over time," Rivas said.

He is a board member of his local Village, Potomac Community Village, and of the Washington Area Village Exchange (WAVE).

"The greatest challenge facing the aging community, in my estimation, is in providing all people with a quality of life as they grow older and eventually more frail," Rivas said.

Aside from his involvement in the aging-in-community/Village movement, Rivas enjoys sharing his background as an educator and naturalist within his community.
